

## Wordless books

- Allow your child to turn the pages of the book and describe what they see in the pictures.
- Take it in turns to tell a page of the story.
- o Did they enjoy the story? Why? What was your favourite part?
- Ask your child to point to different things on the page e.g. Can you point to the boat? Can you find the tree?



## If your child can blend sounds to make words ...

- O Do not ask your child to guess the word by using the pictures.
- Ask your child to <u>sound out</u> the word. Avoid telling them a word they are struggling on patience is key!
- Ask your child to look for 'special friends' in the word These are sounds written with more than one letter e.g. sh th ay
- Read back each sentence or page to keep the plot moving your child's energy is going into reading the words and not the story.
- Praise your child when he or she succeeds Well done \_\_\_\_You have tried really hard.

## If your child can read with speed and accuracy...

- Choose one or two words on the page to discuss their meaning.
- Ask them questions throughout, about what they have just read.
- 0 Talk about whether it is a fiction/non-fiction story.
- Ask them to summarise the book at the end.
- Praise your child when he or she succeeds Well done \_\_\_\_You have tried really hard.
