Explain how Jesus was ready to make his sacrifice during his trial in Mark 15: 1-15 Compare what Luke 23:26-43 and Mark 15:21-41 tell us about Jesus' death. Year 6	<p>Sources</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand that the Bible is made up of different kinds of books and writings and contributed by different authors inspired by the Holy Spirit. Explore the five different types of genres in the Bible and use the Bible references to locate these. Understand that The Old Testament is the Hebrew Scriptures and how they are made up of different writings showing how God revealed himself to his people. Know The New Testament is the fulfilment of the promises made by God in The Old Testament. Understanding that the Gospels were originally passed on orally and are believed to have been written down more than 30 years later, written for slightly different audiences. Explore the similarities and differences of the 4 Gospels. 	<p>Unity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand Jesus' prayer for unity (John 17:11, 20-23) and why Jesus often spoke of the importance of unity among his disciples Explore what 'in communion with Jesus' means using Romans 12 3:10 to support this. Know the Eucharistic prayer and understand that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of being at one with God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, as well as being at one with one another. Recognise the Communion Rite focuses on peace, unity and forgiveness, understanding the important role of the 'Our Father' Know the prayer for peace and unity and understand the importance of sharing the gift of peace and unity with each other 	<p>Death and New Life</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explain that lent is a time to remember the suffering and death of Jesus understanding the symbolism of the ashes on Ash Wednesday Understand what is meant by 'Jesus; the bread of life' using scripture (John 6) Explain what Jesus means by 'unless a grain of wheat dies' in John 12: 24-25 Know the story 'The raising of Lazarus' (John 11: 1-43) and understand its importance. Explore Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord and how modern day services symbolise that of the crucifixion (John 19: 16-42) Recognise the four parts of the Easter Vigil exploring the importance of the signs and symbols.

Year 5	<p>Transformation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explain what happened on the road to Emmaus – Luke 24: 13-35 Explain the transforming power of the Holy Spirit and how it is a gift for everyone Explain how Saul is transformed by the Holy Spirit – Acts 22: 6-16 Explore Paul's message of courage to the Christians living in Rome – Romans 8: 14-17 – how might this have been received Explain how the fruits of the Holy Spirit can be shown in everyday life – Galatians 5: 16-17, 22-23 Explore how the fruits of the Holy Spirit help change and transform the world in which we live. 	<p>Freedom and Responsibility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand why the Israelites accepted the rules (10 commandments) from Moses.
