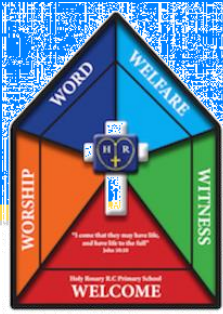


Homework Policy



OVERVIEW

This Policy is set within the context of the School Mission Statement:

**“I come that they may have life and have life to the full”
John 10:10**

We believe that it is important to build strong links between home and school. At all times children will be encouraged to read at home and this will involve children taking reading books home on a regular basis. We are committed to promoting parental involvement in education and so parents will be encouraged to help and support their children for example, by teaching them how to tell the time, sharing Knowledge organisers, completing activities from the ‘un-homework’ and by reading with them on a regular basis.

OBJECTIVES

1. To extend the learning process beyond the school day.
2. To involve learners and their parents in teaching and learning.
3. To build upon teaching and learning in school.
4. To reinforce and extend learning.
5. To share their learning with others.

STRATEGIES

1. It is not compulsory for homework to be set.
2. It is not compulsory for homework to be done.
3. Homework will be set by the class teacher at the beginning of each half term in the form of knowledge organisers and ‘un-homework’ menus.
4. Paper copies will be sent home with the children at the start of each half term. This will also be available for parents on the school website, on the classes page.
5. Homework will be shared with others – all tasks presented by the child will be displayed and PowerPoints shared with the class.
6. Children are expected to read at home, daily. Children in KS1 are expected to read for 20 minutes each day. Children in KS2 are expected to read for 30 minutes each day.
7. All children are expected to practice their spellings regularly. FS will be sent home sound cards, KS1 and KS2 will be sent home weekly spellings.
8. Children are expected to login and play TT Rockstars weekly. Logins are provided by school.

OUTCOMES

This policy will ensure that a sensible approach will be taken by all and that children will benefit through the co-operation of home and school by extending learning beyond the school day.
