



## Behaviour at Holy Rosary

Good behaviour is central to all we do at Holy Rosary RC Primary. High standards of behaviour are expected and promoted at all times in lessons and throughout every aspect of our school's life. All members of staff set high standards and children are given clear guidance about what is expected of them.

Holy Rosary expectations of behaviour are known by all and rewards and sanctions are used to reinforce good behaviour. We will work in partnership with parents to ensure that the school values become central to the lives of our children.

### Behaviour Expectations

Holy Rosary School has a number of behaviour expectations. Children are expected to be:

- **Positive** - (Resilient, keep going, overcoming barriers, coping)
- **Proud** - (Aim high, try your best, Hard working, Good character, Love Holy Rosary)
- **Respectful** - (Think of others, considerate, kind, tolerant, gentle, empathetic)
- **Safe** - (safe behaviour, self-safety (outside school) Well-being, health, world wise)
- **Happy** - (Happy, smile, joy, love, In Jesus name)

### Class systems

Each class will create their own code of conduct based around our school expectations so children understand what this means to them.

These will be displayed in class to remind children what is expected and staff will praise children for displaying these behaviours.

There are systems in class that help monitor children's behaviour but to support them in displaying the highest level of behaviour.

In class, there will be 4 stars to indicate levels of behaviour.

The blue star is where all children start the day. This shows that we know all children are capable of the highest standard.





## Rewards

Each day, only children who have stayed in the blue star and showed star behaviour ALL DAY will be awarded a gold star point.

This Star point is to be put into our behaviour app called class dojo.

At the end of the week, children with a star point for every day at school will receive a weekly behaviour sticker in our Friday reward assembly.

At the end of term, we will count how many daily stars each child has received. Children who have achieved 95%-100% of the stars achievable will be awarded a **Gold Award**.

- Children who have achieved 90-94% of the stars achievable will be awarded a **Silver Award**.
- Children who have achieved 85-89% of the stars achievable will be awarded a **Bronze Award**.
- Children who achieve **Gold** will take part in a reward afternoon and this will be decided by our School Council.

## Consequences

Children who fall into the **Red** star will receive a consequence depending on the behaviour that has been displayed.

These behaviours fall into 2 categories - Level 1 & Level 2



Level 1 consequences – These are awarded for low level disruption such as distracting others, unkind words, poor presentation, incomplete uniform.

Level 1 consequences are:

- Missed playtime
- 5 minutes with classteacher
- Moved to new working environment

Level 2 consequences – These are awarded for behaviours that are deemed more serious and are usually intent to hurt someone. Such behaviours are lying, physical harm such as kicking, hitting, racial/homophobic comments, swearing.

Level 2 consequences are:

- Internal isolation
- Missed Dinnertime
- Missed school event



All these behaviours and consequences will be recorded on our electronic school system called CPOMS. Parents will also receive a behaviour slip or phone call. Behaviour slips **MUST** be signed and returned to school. Each term, the School leadership team will monitor if any children need some further support.
